



Useful evidence & Information to bring with you when filing for an injunction/restraining order

- Drivers license with current address
- You work name, phone number (this number could show up on respondents call logs) and address
- Phone records with call log/text log from respondent highlighted
- Posts made by respondent on any social media or messaging applications (including media, pictures, etc)-Time stamped
- Letters or any correspondence left on your car, at your job, at your home or anywhere from the respondent
- Names, numbers and addresses of witnesses to respondents behaviors or threats
- Pictures of damage made to any property, gifts or any signs of violence
- Respondents full name, number and address of home and work
- Police case number
- Police report
- Hospital/Doctors appointment records for incidents related to the respondents behavior
- Pictures of any bodily harm, even if it still exists at the time of filing, you want to leave them this evidence in case they don't have a camera
- Any messages that were threatening from third parties given on behalf of the respondent
- Names and badge numbers of any detectives working on current cases between you and the respondent
- Lease agreements showing the respondents name either on or not on the lease to aid in proving "squatting" or the respondent not removing themselves from your home
